ECRI General Policy Recommendation No.15 - adopted on 8 December 2015 + **Key Topics**
 - Combating the dissemination of racist, xenophobic and antisemitic material via the Internet
ECRI General Policy Recommendation No.6 - adopted on 15 December 2000

- ECRI has published several studies on this issue, the most recent being:
 - Cyberhate: an issue of continued concern for the Council of Europe's Anti-Racism Commission (2016) - Chara Bakalis

ECRI's findings

- ❑ Internet: an important vehicle for promoting racism and intolerance
- ❑ Groups of concern: migrants, Roma, visible minorities such as Black people, Jews, Muslims, LGBTI people

Remedies

- Raise **public awareness**
- Provide **support for those targeted** by hate speech both individually and collectively
- Provide **support for self-regulation** by public and private institutions (including elected bodies, political parties, educational institutions and cultural and sports organisations)
- **Clarify responsibility under civil and administrative law**

Recommendations

- ❑ Additional Protocol to the Convention on Cybercrime
- ❑ Regulation regarding the Internet and social media providers
- ❑ Reinforce the civil and administrative law protection against cyber hate speech
- ❑ Counteract the presence of racist expression on the Internet

Recommendations

- ❑ Co-operate at international level with other states to avoid any legal loopholes
- ❑ National cybercrime units and Police units responsibility for combating hate speech
- ❑ Build up awareness among internet users and motivate internet companies to enforce the existing codes of conduct
- ❑ Task and fund an organisation to monitor proactively the internet for hate speech.

Good practices

- ❑ Croatia: 24/7 contact point for cybercrime
- ❑ Finland: code of ethics for internet providers
- ❑ France: discussions with Twitter
- ❑ Germany, Poland: international cooperation concerning overseas servers
- ❑ Norway: media suppress possibility anonymous comments
- ❑ Ireland: counterspeech by members of the Irish Government
